


Curbside Recycling: The "Big Four"

Lancaster County Solid Waste Management Authority (LCSWMA) is where all trash and recycling collected in Lancaster County goes. In 2018, LCSWMA put the following guidelines in place. Curbside recycling in Lancaster County is single-stream, which means that all recyclable materials go in the same container, and are later sorted at a recycling processing center. Use this guide to help keep Lancaster green!

Focus on the BIG 4! Put only these items in your recycling bin



All other items, such as those below, do not belong in your recycling bin.





batteries, electronics, food waste, Christmas lights, garden hoses

PLACES TO RECYCLE ITEMS BANNED FROM THE BIN

Newspaper, office paper, magazines, phone books, hard and soft cover books: Lancaster city's drop-off recycling center, 850 New Holland Ave.

Magazines: Darrenkamp's Market, Elizabethtown; Ephrata Public Works Complex, Church Ave.; McDonald's, 1434 Manheim Pike rear lot, Lancaster, West Lampeter Township rear building; Lancaster Airport, container left of Winkie's and The Pilot Shop; Wissler Motors, Mount Joy

Batteries: Get collection bags from your municipality and place batteries beside your trash or drive to Household Hazardous Waste facility at 1299 Harrisburg Pike, Lancaster

Plastic bags: Many grocery stores recycle them

Go online to **Earth911.com** and plug in your location and recycling item to find the nearest place to recycle
